- Formed in 2017 with support of Supervisor Jim Steele
- Collects community input on variety of subjects such as levee maintenance, community development projects (such as Dollar General or Biochar), and safety concerns
- Made up of community members volunteering their time and efforts
- Following the examples of community leaders Gene Paleno and Melinda
 Wright

Pyle Road Cleanup

- Formed to address illegal dumping and squatting on Pyle Road in Nice
- In the last year, significant code enforcement efforts have been made thanks to officers Norman "Joey" Valdez and Logan Smith



Upper Lake Levee Subcommittee

- Approximately 1958, Army Corps of Engineers and the Bureau of Reclamation built the Middle Creek and Clover Creek diversions. Also relocated a lower portion of Clover Creek south of Hwy 20
- There are continued issues around sediment deposits and vegetation growth
- Maintenance between 1960-1996 was managed by State Water Resources
- In 1996 transferred to Lake County
- Immediate need is in vegetation growth

Upper Lake Levee Subcommittee

- Constant change in water resources department has resulted in loss of institutional knowledge
- Upper Lake residents have knowledge and skill in levee maintenance and are looking forward to continued dialogue with the County Watershed Protection District

Upper Lake School Traffic Safety

- Created to address the ongoing safety concerns during the 8:00am pickups and 2:00pm drop offs of the Upper Lake Unified School District.
- Successes have included adding the Stop Sign and "No Left Turn" signs on school private property
- In discussion with Public Works to consider speed bumps on Second Street
- Need for continued conversation on placing Stop sign on Second Street and Middle Creek

Improving Communication

- Core responsibility of WRTH is to bridge community members and BOS
- Attempts for public information requests and at requesting county officials to present or attend meetings have been ineffective at times
- Hoping to build stronger relationships with County officials to improve communication chains
- Looking forward to increasing responsiveness and mutual success between WRTH members and County officials
