AB 1250: Still a Bad Bill

Still Attacks Services for the Vulnerable

Despite the amendments, AB 1250 will ***still*** fundamentally disrupt the ability of counties to contract with nonprofits and local businesses to deliver vital public health, public safety, mental health and social services for children, elderly, the disabled and the most vulnerable among us.

AB 1250 as amended September 5, 2017:

- ***Still*** restricts county authority to contract with nonprofits, community based organizations and private providers.
- ***Still*** diminishes or stops local service delivery, including safety net services.
- ***Still*** applies to new contracts and existing contract renewals and extensions.
- ***Still*** imposes a long list of expensive, time-consuming bureaucratic requirements on nonprofits and service providers that could result in unnecessary gaps and delays in service delivery.
- ***Still*** creates new costs for local taxpayers and the State of California.
- ***Still*** requires service providers to share the names and wages of their employees and subcontracted employees on a monthly basis which, as a public record, raises serious privacy concerns.
- ***Still*** is opposed by hundreds of nonprofits and organizations representing children, seniors, public health, public safety, local governments, and advocates for our most vulnerable.
