I believe that the Planning Commissioners denial of UP 20-40 was correct. I base this on the fact that the Kelseyville Unified School District owns the property within 1000 feet of the applicant, which is in direction conflict with the Lake County Cannabis Code. The school district has a school building on the property and per the letter from SCLS, the building and the property will be used by school district children in the future.

Additionally, our county is being overrun by these monstrous cannabis projects. It is my opinion based on the cannabis industry, most of these projects will be bankrupted in a few years. It is passed time to properly staff CDD so that a proper investigation of applicant sites can be completed. This will lead to more accurate information in the Initial Study reports.
