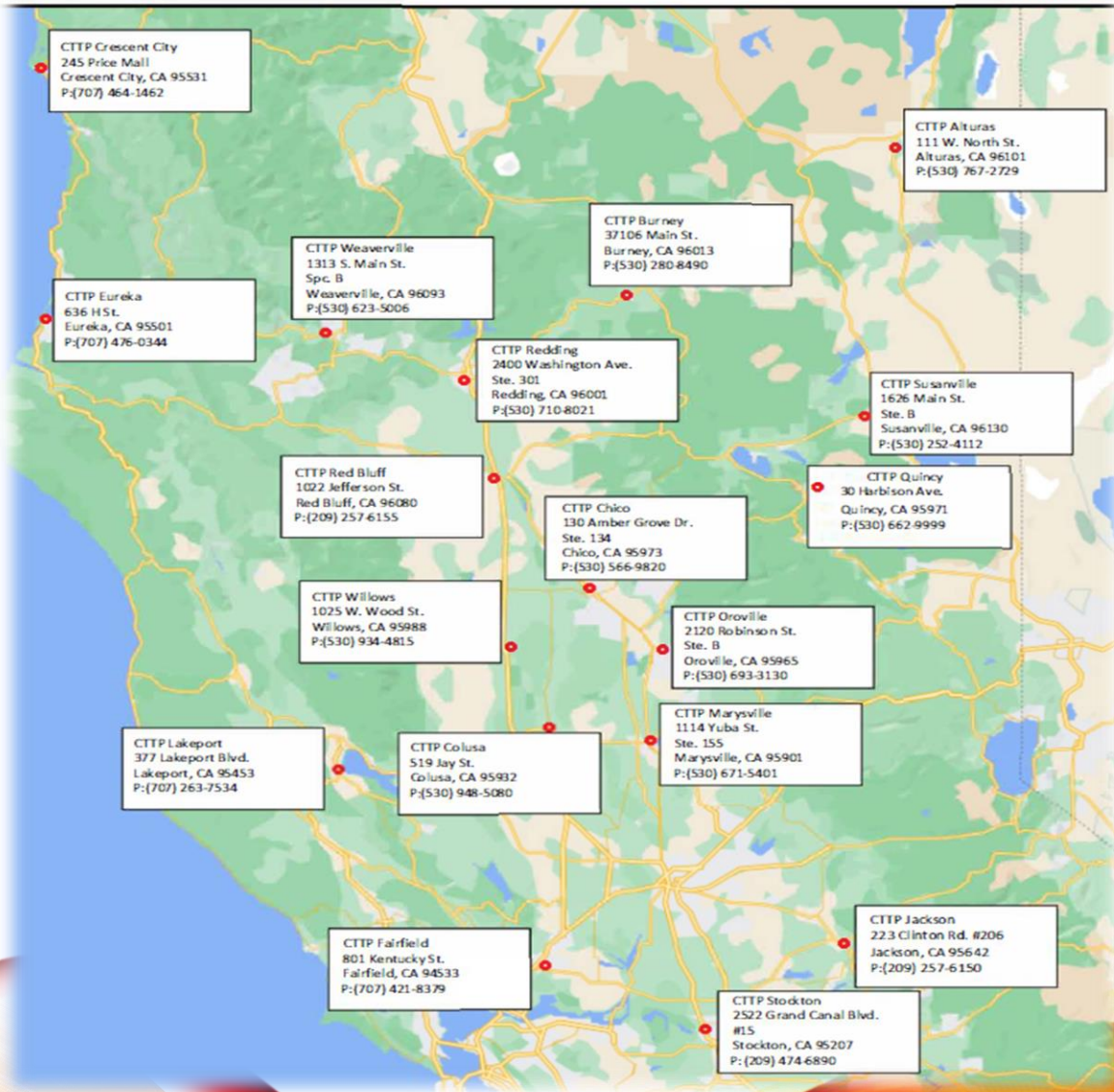

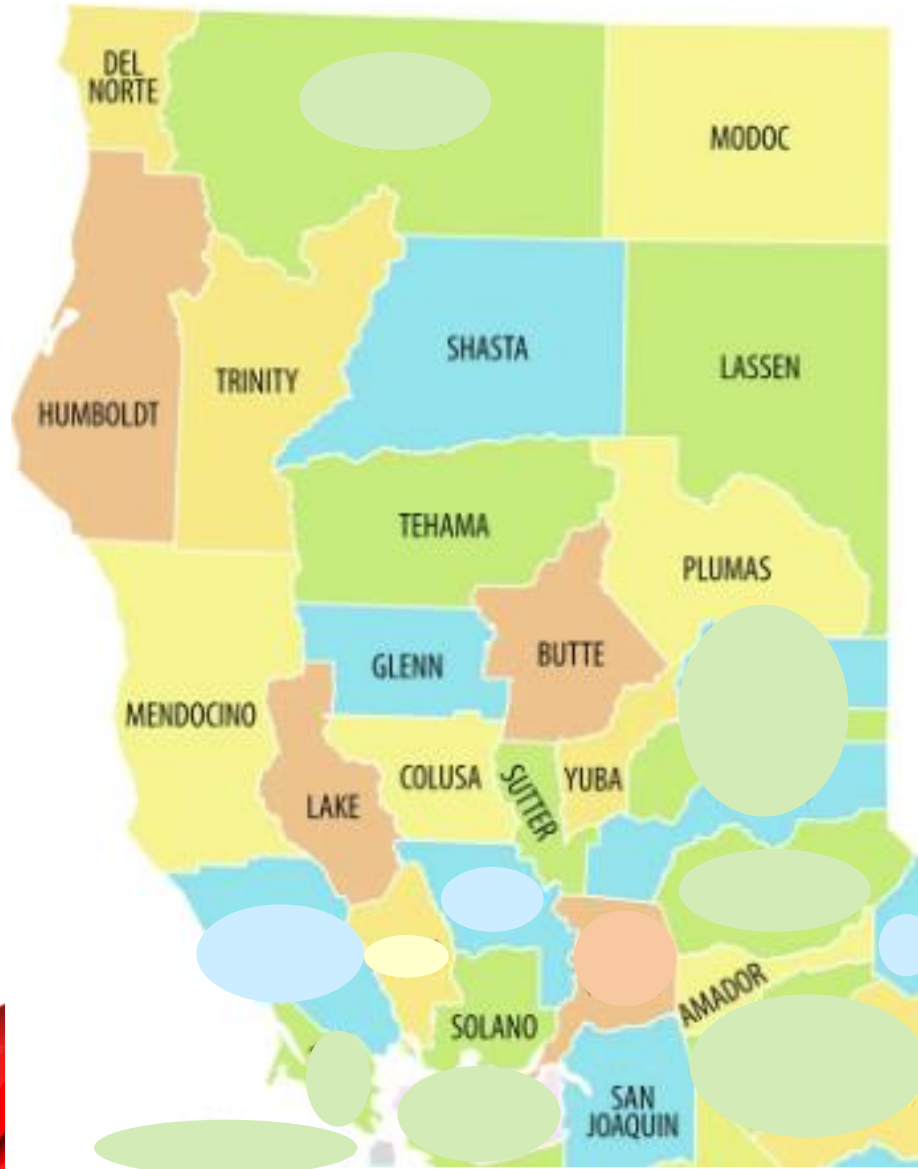
CALIFORNIA TRIBAL TANF PARTNERSHIP

TANF – FOUR PURPOSES



1. Provide assistance to needy families so that children may be cared for in their own homes
2. Reduce the dependency of needy parents by promoting job preparation, work and marriage
3. Prevent and reduce out of wedlock pregnancies
4. Encourage the formation and maintenance of two-parent families

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN TRIBAL TANF AND CALWORKS

- Strengthen families by celebrating their cultural heritage
- Smaller Caseloads
- Focus beyond employment: wellness, 2-generation/multi generation approach
- Drug Testing/Home Visits



COUNTY PROGRAMS

CalFresh and Medi-Cal remain with County Welfare Department's

Native American families have the choice between CalWORKs or Tribal TANF (where available)

ELIGIBILITY

Needy Cases

- Must meet CTPP income guidelines
- Resident of CTPP service area
- One child under 18
- One child in the home must be a Native child
- Adult(s) must not have exceeded 60-month time limit

Eligibility

Non-Needy Relative Caregiver Cases

- Caregiver must meet CTPP non-needy income guidelines
- Care for a related Native child
- Resident in a CTPP service area
- One child under 18
- Each child must be a Native child
- Paid a monthly rate per age, similar to Foster care

- Other cultural events are integrated into each site specific to the individual community.
- Community Elder involvement to preserve the integrity of the Native Culture.
- Capacity building for our next generations through culture camps, employment and educational activities.
