Rural CUPA Support Grant Guidelines

For purposes of this grant, a Rural County is defined as a county where the population is less than 150,000 and where there is no incorporated city with a population greater than 50,000. A Rural County CUPA may apply for a Rural CUPA Support Grant to help fully implement the Unified Program within their county. The combined total of the Unified Program fees billed and the Rural CUPA Support Grant amount received shall not exceed the CUPA's Unified Program budget. Rural CUPA Support Grant funds may only be expended in support of the county's Unified Program. A Rural County CUPA may only receive grant funding from either the Rural Reimbursement Grant or the Rural CUPA Support Grant, not both.

General allocation standards:

- If the county has a population of less than 70,000 persons, the amount of the funds allocated from the account shall not exceed 75 percent of the budgeted costs as approved by the local governing body for implementation of the Unified Program. The remaining 25 percent is required to come from local Unified Program fees in compliance with Health and Safety Code, section 25404.5(a)(2).
- If the county has a population of more than 70,000, but less than 100,000 persons, the amount of the funds allocated from the account shall not exceed 50 percent of the budgeted costs as approved by the local governing body for implementation of the Unified Program. The remaining 50 percent is required to come from local Unified Program fees in compliance with Health and Safety Code, section 25404.5(a)(2).
- If the county has a population of more than 100,000 but less than 150,000 persons, the amount of the funds allocated from the account shall not exceed 35 percent of the budgeted costs as approved by the local governing body for implementation of the Unified Program. The remaining 65 percent is required to come from local Unified Program fees in compliance with Health and Safety Code, section 25404.5(a)(2).

A Rural County CUPA must indicate in the Rural CUPA Support Grant application how they will provide for the more highly technical and certified staffing requirements to support Unified Program elements, including but not limited to, the CalARP and UST program elements. This could include, but not be limited to: contract agreements for services, interagency agreements with other CUPAs, and MOUs between counties.

To receive a disbursement from the Rural CUPA Support Grant, a county must meet certification requirements and provide all of the following to the Unified Program:

1. A completed application for Rural CUPA Support Grant.
2. A copy of the final CUPA Budget approved by the Board of Supervisors for fiscal year 2017-2018. This budget should contain a breakdown of the specific CUPA funding.
3. Official documentation of population. (*Department of Finance population estimate January 1, 2017 or other recognized source.*

4. Documentation that explains how the Rural County CUPA will provide for the more highly technical and certified staffing requirements to support Unified Program elements, including but not limited to the CalARP and UST program elements.
5. For CUPAs who received funds from the FY 2016-2017 Rural Reimbursement Grant, a completed Rural Reimbursement Grant Year-End Worksheet for FY 2016-2017 with the actual expenditures detail sheet attachment must also be submitted with this grant.

Note: A year-end worksheet/report and a detailed expenditure sheet will be required to close out this grant. CalEPA will provide the worksheet/report template to all grant recipients.
