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Abatement of Dilapidated Lakebed Structures Project Proposal

- 2 **Project Title:** Abatement of Dilapidated Lakebed Structures
- 3 **Project Brief:** Across the shoreline of Clear Lake there is an abundance of dilapidated shoreline
- 4 structures which plague our lake. These structures pose a safety, water quality, navigation, and
- 5 visual hazard for boaters, investors, and other community members of Clear Lake. To date Lake
- 6 County Water Resources have inventoried 42 dilapidated structures only Hwy 20 alone. As a
- 7 rough estimation there are possibly 100-200 structures along Clear Lake.
- 8 **Funding Request:** \$250,000 with a \$70,000 match from Lake County Water Resources
- 9 **Project Costs:** The budget for this project varies for each structure. Previous project's
- 10 demolition cost and marine contractor quotes estimated that the dilapidated structures will
- 11 cost \$5,000 \$10,000 to remove per structure (\$400-\$500 per piling). The \$250,000 will be the
- 12 seed money to create a revolving fund to continuously abate dilapidated lakebed structures.
- 13 **Project Goal:** The purpose of this project is to remove dilapidated shoreline structures across
- 14 Clear Lake. As mentioned previously, these structures pose a safety, water quality, navigation,
- and visual hazard to Clear Lake. As visitors and residents drive the highly trafficked Hwy 20
- 16 corridor, they are distracted from our beautiful lake by an abundance of these improperly
- 17 maintained shoreline structures.
- 18 While the Ch 23 Shoreline Ordinance states *"If Lakebed Management finds that improvements*
- 19 constructed pursuant to an administrative encroachment permit or in operation or use under an
- 20 encroachment lease are not being maintained or operated in a safe condition or are not being
- 21 maintained or operated in accordance with the provisions and purposes of this chapter Lakebed
- 22 Management shall notify the Community Development Department who may declare the
- 23 structure, improvement or operation to be a nuisance and may proceed to abate the nuisance
- 24 pursuant to the procedure set forth in Chapter 13 of this Code". Lake County Water Resources
- 25 have spoken to CDD officers who have stated they do not have enough monies in their
- 26 revolving fund to abate shoreline structures.
- 27 These structures will be addressed strategically one-by-one, the end goal is to have a standard
- of upkeep that landowners are required to abide by when they place lakebed structures within
- 29 the public trust of Clear Lake.

30 Approach and Timeline

- 31 Part 1: Lake County Water Resources starts an inventory of dilapidated lakebed structures. This
- 32 inventory shall include: GPS location, pictures, date/time, APN, site address, owner info, and
- 33 mailing address. <u>Completed/Ongoing: February 2021</u>
- 34 Part 2: Reach out to property owners with an informal letter notifying the dilapidated structure
- 35 owner of current conditions, corrective actions, and a request to notify Lakebed Management
- 36 within (12) days of receiving the letter. <u>Completed/Ongoing: May 2021</u>

- 1 Part 3: Prepare RFQ (Request for Quotes) and contracts for abatement of dilapidated lakebed
- 2 structures. Release RFQ and award contractors. Anticipated RFQ Release September 2021
- 3 **Part 4:** Work with landowners, marine contractors, and outside funding sources to initiate the
- 4 demolition projects and abate these structures. Water Resources currently has funding
- 5 available to address ~5 structures during this current fiscal year. <u>Anticipated Start October 2021</u>
- 6 and Ongoing with Revolving Fund
- 7 **Part 5:** The cost of abatement will be assessed on the owner (per Lake County Code Ch 13
- 8 Abatement of Nuisances) and any funds recouped will go back to the revolving fund to continue
- 9 abatement of lakebed structures. Anticipated Start October 2021 and Ongoing with Revolving
- 10 <u>Fund</u>
- 11 Abatement Details: Lake County Code Chapter 23 Shoreline Ordinance.
- 12 Lakebed Management is tasked with identifying if "improvements constructed pursuant to an
- 13 encroachment lease are not being maintained or operated in a safe condition. Lakebed
- 14 Management shall notify the Community Development Department who may declare the
- 15 structure a nuisance and may proceed to abate the nuisance pursuant to Chapter 13 of this
- 16 Code"

17 Lake County Code Chapter 13 Nuisances

- 18 2.1 Findings. The Board of Supervisors finds it is necessary to the public interest to promote
- 19 the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the County of Lake by providing procedures
- for the abatement of nuisances, which abatement procedures shall be in addition to all other
- 21 proceedings authorized by this Code or otherwise by law.
- 22 2.2 Purpose. This Code is intended to provide a uniform and comprehensive method for the
- 23 identification and abatement of public nuisances within the unincorporated areas of the County
- 24 of Lake and to impose any costs of such abatement against the owners of the offending
- 25 properties. Any nuisance, as defined herein, existing on any parcel of land in the
- 26 unincorporated area in the County of Lake, may be abated as herein provided.
- 27 Sec. 13-6. Notice of Nuisance and Order to Abate. If upon making a reasonable determination
- that a nuisance exists as defined by Section 13-3 e. of this Chapter, the Enforcement Official
- shall cause a Notice of Nuisance and Order to Abate to be prepared, and shall serve such notice
- 30 and order as provided in Section 13-6.2 herein.
- 31 Sec. 13-8. Failure of Property Owner to Abate. If the property owner or other responsible
- 32 party fails to abate the nuisance within the time specified by the Enforcement Official, or the
- Board of Supervisors after a hearing, and is not granted a time extension, the Enforcement
- 34 Official is authorized to secure, remove, demolish, raze or otherwise abate the nuisance at the
- 35 expense of the owner(s).

- 1 Sec. 13-39. Accounting. 39.1 The Board may create a revolving fund or funds from which may
- 2 be paid the costs of enforcing the provisions of this chapter, and into which shall be paid the
- 3 receipts from the collection of costs as hereinafter set forth.
- 4 On 6/09/2021 The Board authorized \$100,000 from the Internal Cannabis Tax for the
- 5 abatement of lakebed structures and vessels. \$30,000 is to be allocated specifically for sunken
- 6 and abandoned vessels, \$70,000 is to be allocated for dilapidated lakebed structures.

7 Contracting Information:

- 8 Multiple contractors may be contracted for the abatement of lakebed structures and used on a
- 9 rotational basis. Awarding of an abatement project for any specific contractor will be based on
- 10 the lowest priced quote for that specific abatement project.
