In my 24 years as a Lake County resident, my husband and I have dedicated ourselves to the community and county. We truly believe that Lake County is a beautiful place and we defend all that it has to offer against many that feel it is a lesser place. Organizers of this county have made mistakes in the past and we have all had to suffer and push through and keep building it up. You now have the decision to do what is best for not only our neighborhood but the county.

I am not against marijuana cultivation, I am against its cultivation next to developed communities. This is a large county and already has many places where marijuana is grown with little backlash.
