Dear Mr. Porter:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Major Use Permit and Categorical Exemption to allow a corn maze and pumpkin patch, including 50 parking spaces, 4 portable restrooms and a 10' x 10' booth for taking in cash. The maze and pumpkin patch would operate between late September and early November each year, primarily during weekends and exclusively during daylight hours. The proposed project is located three miles northwest of the community of Kelseyville on State Route 29 (SR 29) where it is bisected by Thomas Dr. We have the following comments:

- Due to existing traffic volumes and collision history in the area, additional turning movements onto Thomas Dr. will require left turn channelization for northbound traffic. There is an existing southbound acceleration lane on the southern edge of the intersection of SR 29 with Thomas Dr. that we will require to be re-striped as a northbound left-hand turn pocket for vehicles entering the project site.
- The applicant will need to obtain an encroachment permit from Caltrans to perform any work within the Caltrans Right-of-Way. Applications are reviewed for consistency with State standards and are subject to Department approval. The applicant must meet the Lake County Division of Environmental Health requirements regarding on-site wastewater treatment and potable water requirements.

Our office has on file a 1969 septic permit for a 2 bedroom residence (trailer) and a 1975 septic permit for a labor camp. On November 20, 2017 our office received a phone call from Code Enforcement regarding the abandonment of the septic system and demolishing of Ag building. Our office has no record of a septic abandonment permit. Our office generated a complaint to investigate abandonment and a letter was sent to the property owner regarding the abandonment of a septic system without a permit on January 31, 2018. There has been no response from that letter. Owner needs to contact our office to resolve the complaint issue prior to approvals.

The applicant must comply with the California Retail Food Code Regulations.

113789. Food Facility

- (c) "FOOD FACILITY" does not include any of the following:
- (6) An outlet or location, including but not limited to, premises operated by a PRODUCER, selling or offering for sale only whole PRODUCE grown by the PRODUCER or shell EGGS, or both, provided the sales are conducted at an outlet or location controlled by the PRODUCER.

A food permit will not be required if the applicant only sells whole fruit and vegetables on property owned or controlled by producer and no sampling is involved.
