AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 5 OF CHAPTER 3 OF THE LAKE COUNTY CODE RELATING TO COMMERCIAL WEIGHING AND MEASURING DEVICE REGISTRATION PROGRAM

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LAKE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Board of Supervisors finds and determines that the current fees under Section 53.2 of Article 5, Chapter 3 of the Lake County Code are not sufficient to recover reasonable administrative and enforcement costs incurred for exercising supervision over and performing investigations, safekeeping and certification of state standards, and for certification services by the Lake County Department of Agriculture/Weights & Measures. The amendments made by this Ordinance are intended to increase fees in accordance with Article 2.1, Chapter 2, Division 5 of the Business and Professions Code.

Section 2: Section 3-53.2 of Article V of Chapter 3 of the Lake County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

53.2 Annual Fee: An annual registration fee shall be charged for the calendar year (January 1 through December 31), or any part thereof, for all commercial weighing or measuring devices. For purposes of this section, the annual registration fee for a business that uses a commercial weighing or measuring device or devices shall consist of a business location fee, a Department of Food and Agriculture administrative fee, as specified in Business and Professions Code Section 12241, and a device fee, as outlined in the latest County of Lake's Master Fee Schedule adopted by the County of Lake Board of Supervisors in accordance with Section 12240 of the California Business and Professions Code.

Section 3: The Board of Supervisors finds this ordinance is not a project within the meaning of section 15378 of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") Guidelines, because there is no potential for it to result in an impact to or physical change in the environment, either directly or indirectly. In the event this ordinance is found to be subject to CEQA, it is exempt from CEQA pursuant to section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, known as the "Common Sense" exemption, because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility of a significant effect on the environment.
