I. SUMMARY

The applicants, Mr. and Mrs. Rossetti request the vacation of a portion of Summer Drive which has historically been used as a driveway to APNs 050-394-15 & 16. Public access from Anderson Creek to Anderson Springs Road is located nearby on a portion of Alder Lane which was constructed to be straighter and easier to navigate than Summer Drive. The vacation of Summer Drive will aid the Rossetti's in their Valley Fire rebuild project. Staff recommends the Planning Commission find this project is in conformance with the General Plan.

RE: Vacation of Summer Drive

Dear Mr. De Leon,

As property owners of lots APN 393-050-000, 1410 Anderson Springs Road and APN 050-394-150-000, 19750 Summer Drive, we are requesting vacating, the old road (from before 1937) that still shows on the map as a through road to Alder. I have included a short history on Summer Drive and the Anderson/Patriquin family with a map marked with a green line showing the old Summer Drive. There was no Anderson Springs Road prior to the 1937 mapping by Ray Meade.

I was able to verify the information from some of the neighbor's deeds. I also must mention that Dr. Anderson gave the county a portion of the APN 93-050-000 lot to the county so they could make a viable entrance onto Alder Lane. Certainly this is recorded somewhere in your records. Without the Vacation, we will be unable to rebuild losing the two lots and our neighbors, the Copus family would also have to give up their rebuild dreams. We own a lot on Alder, APN 050-393-030-000, and 11395 Alder Lane that we will not build upon. The road in question does not have an APN number, has never been maintained by the county and was always considered to be part of the two lots mentioned above, since the portion of the Anderson Springs Road lot was given to the county by Dr. Anderson

There are photos of the area in your files as well as community support notes. There will not be anyone landlocked. We will not be searching title reports. There is no legal description available and other than the 1937 map no other survey map. No one else uses the driveway except our neighbors, the Copus family. We have stopped our architect for now and are not willing to put out any more dollars until the situation is settled.

However, I must object to the lengthy process mentioned in the papers sent with the application, it seems unfair to take up to a year over such an easily remedied situation. Mr. Ray Meade in 1937, 81 years ago, did away with Summer Drive, put in Anderson Springs Road and sold the lots on Summer Drive to my neighbors. Our cabin was already there, built in 1929, some 87 years ago, so it landed on Summer Drive with an access onto the new Anderson Springs Road. Sadly it has developed into a situation that quite possibly will not allow a rebuild for us or our neighbors, Vigil and Adele Copus. We must have an answer either to deny or affirm and hope that the county will use their good will and largesse before sewer vote so we know where stand on the rebuild.

We have always used the merchants in Lake County for everything from appliances to lumber. It is disheartening to find out that after paying taxes and supporting the Lake County economy that a small piece of property 10 feet wide that narrows down to two feet wide by 117 feet can stop us from rebuilding.

We need an immediate answer.....and again before the sewer vote.

The following is a history of the area that once was Summer Drive.

In 1874 the Anderson/Patriquin families discovered Lake County through a friend in Vallejo. They developed the New Oat Hill Quicksilver Mine. Even after the mine failed, they kept their close ties to the Springs.

In 1929, Mrs. Alex Anderson, the wife of the Alex Anderson built the cabin which sat on Summer Drive. The Anderson family operated a hotel and invested in the cinnabar mines that were discovered in the area. That investment did not prove to be a successful venture for the Anderson/Patriquin families. In 1937 the Anderson family sold the Springs to Ray Meade, who did the map which the county is still using today. I have the original map in my procession.

Summer Drive was the only road going toward the recreation center. It started by the bridge that is closest to the entrance, then along the creek where it took a very sharp turn onto Alder Lane. Two of the Anderson brothers and one sister built cabins along that road prior to 1937

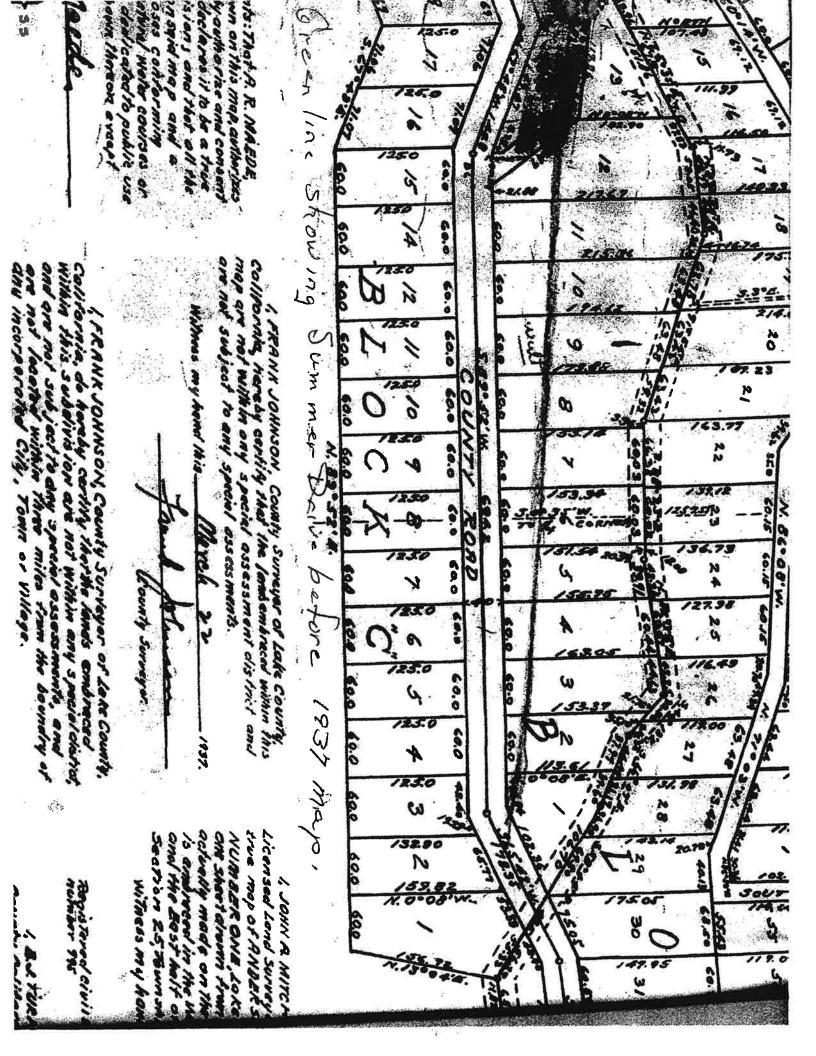
When Mr. Meade acquired the property he did the separate lots which are much the same as today. Many of those lots sat right on Summer Drive which is verified in the deeds. The county must have abandoned the road at that time or they have stopped the building process.

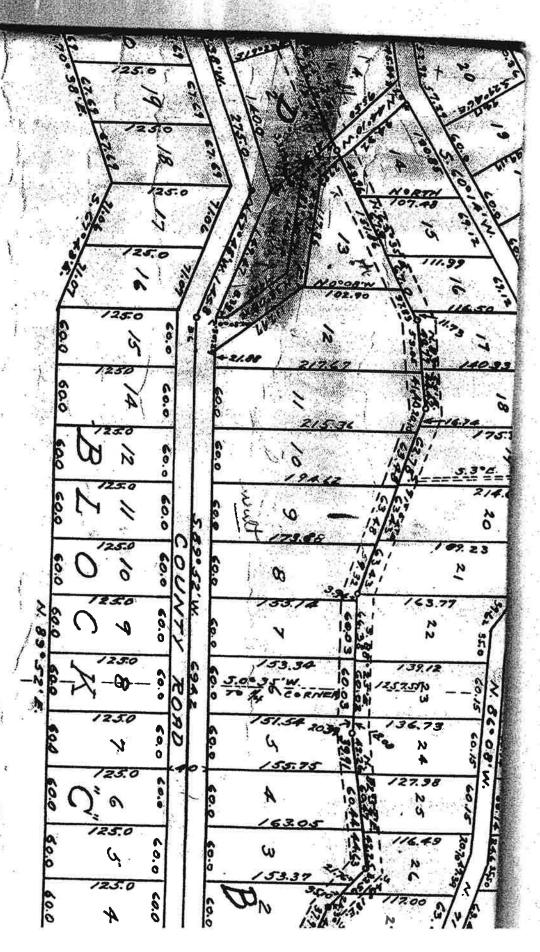
In 1940 the Ford family purchased a lot on Alder Lane and started building their cabin. Mrs. Naomi Ford Tambornini was a small child and remembers that the trucks had to unload and reload to make the turn from Summer Drive onto Alder. So at that time Dr. Walter Anderson donated a portion of lot 050-393-050-000, 11410 Anderson Spring Road to the county so Alder could commence at Anderson Springs Road, which it has been for 77 years. I have not been able to find any documentation on the transaction......it was probably done with a handshake back then.

I worked for Dr. Anderson for over 25 years and we spent all of our summers where and our children and grandchildren have made lifelong friends. In 1984, we inherited the cabin and done a bit of remodeling, but it was basically the same. We have maintained Summer Drive and it is our driveway and parking area.

I have a history of how the Anderson and Patriquins came to this county, their histories and how they came to own Anderson Springs. It was written in 1944 by Lou Patriquin (Uncle Lou's cabin). Someday I will talk to the Gibson Library people regarding a donation of the papers.

Our families' love for the Springs and in their words "the happiest place on earth", want to rebuild and are hoping that the county will work with us to make the rebuild happen.

This is in response to your letter, dated February 17, 2017, informing PG&E of the proposed vacation of a portion of Summer Drive in Anderson Springs Subdivision, Middletown, in the County of Lake.

An investigation indicates that PG&E is presently operating and maintaining utility facilities within the proposed area to be abandoned. If the abandonment is approved by the City Council/Board of Supervisors, we respectfully request that the following reservation be inserted in the Resolution of Vacation or Abandonment for the proposed area to be abandoned:

RESERVING therefrom pursuant to the provisions of Section 8340 of the Streets and Highways Code and for the benefit of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, the permanent easement and the right at any time and from time to time to construct, reconstruct, maintain, operate, replace, remove, repair, renew and enlarge lines of pipes, conduits, cables, wires, poles, electrical conductors, and other equipment, fixtures and appurtenances for the operation of electric, gas, and communication facilities, including access, and also the rights to trim and cut down trees and brush that may be a hazard to the facilities; said area shall be kept open and free of buildings, structures and wells of any kind."

In reference to your request regarding the proposed general vacation of a portion of 11410 ANDERSON SPRINGS ROAD & 19750 SUMMER DR. Please refer to Exhibit "A", attached.

AT&T California maintains communication facilities within that portion of the above mentioned vacation which must be retained for service to the area and beyond. AT&T requests the following language be incorporated in any resolution of vacation from the County of Lake of these portions of 11410 ANDERSON SPRINGS ROAD & 19750 SUMMER DR.

"EXCEPTING AND RESERVING THEREFROM PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF Section 8340 of the Street and Highways Code and for the benefit of Pacific Bell Telephone Company doing business as AT&T California, the permanent easement and the right at any time or from time to time to construct, maintain, operate, replace, remove, renew and enlarge lines of pipe, conduits, cables, wires, poles and other convenient structures, equipment, and fixtures for the operation of telegraph and telephone lines and other communication facilities, including access to protect the same from all hazards, in, upon, over, and across the portions of 11410 ANDERSON SPRINGS ROAD & 19750 SUMMER DR to be abandoned."

If the certified copy of the resolution of vacation includes the foregoing language and is recorded in accordance with the law, AT&T shall have no objection to the proposed vacation.
