# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING LEASES OF DISTRICT-OWNED LANDS FOR AGRICULTURAL USES WITHIN THE MIDDLECREEK FLOOD DAMAGE REDUCTION

### AND ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Lake County Watershed Protection District Act (hereinafter, the "Act") includes among its purposes to provide for the control, impounding, treatment, and disposal of the flood and storm waters of the Lake County Watershed Protection District (hereinafter, the "District"), the conservation and protection of waters within the District, to protect from flood or storm waters the watercourses, lakes, groundwater, watersheds, harbors, public highways, life and property in the District, and to develop and improve the quality of all waters within the District for all beneficial uses.

WHEREAS, the Act empowers the District to let and dispose of real and personal property of every kind as necessary or proper to carry out any of the objects of purposes of the Act and convenient to the full exercise of its powers; and

WHEREAS, the Act further provides that the Board of Directors of the District may determine, by resolution, that any real property held by the District not presently needed by the District for its own uses and purposes, may be leased in a manner prescribed by law for such action by counties; and

WHEREAS, during the lengthy period of property acquisitions within the Project area necessary to effectuate the restoration of this habitat, the District has historically let the real properties thus acquired to persons interested in putting said properties to an agricultural use which will prevent and/or reduce illegal dumping and other illicit conduct that may negatively impact the efficacy of returning these properties to a functional wetland; and

WHEREAS, the County of Lake has established alternate procedures for leasing and licensing real property, which, at the discretion of the County Administrative Officer or her designee, excludes leases and licenses from the formal bidding procedures of Government Code Sections 25526 et seq.,

and the informal bidding procedures of Section 2-190 of the Lake County Code when a lease or license is not of a duration exceeding ten (10) years, is non-renewable, and has an estimated monthly rental not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the Middle Creek Flood Damage Reduction and Ecosystem Restoration Project (Project) will restore damaged habitat and the water quality of the Clear Lake watershed, returning this area to a functional wetland, which will have a significant affect on the watershed health and the water quality of Clear Lake; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District and of the goals of this Project to allow such leases, while ensuring the understanding of any prospective lessee of the temporary nature of any such lease and the potential risks to any contemplated agricultural operation given nature's eventual return of the Project area to a functional wetland.

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Board of Directors hereby finds and declares that the real properties located within the Project area and not already subject to lease agreements are not presently needed for District use and may, therefore, be leased for agricultural use.
- 2. That said leases shall extend for a period of no more than ten (10) years and the monthly rental charges may not exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per month.
- 3. That the County Administrative Officer or her designee is hereby authorized to proceed with the leasing of said properties pursuant to the requirements of Section 2-192 of the Lake County Code and utilizing a Request for Proposals (hereinafter, "RFP") process.
- 4. That the RFP contain unequivocal and express language regarding the limitations of any lease agreement and must require any prospective lessee to assume any and all risks associated with engaging in an agricultural use within the Project area given the unpredictable but eventual return of the Project area to wetland.
- 5. That any existing lease agreements continue in full force and effect for their respective durations.
- 6. That any resolutions or orders in conflict herewith are superceded and replaced by this Resolution.
