**A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING PROTECTION OF OUR OCEAN AND COAST FROM OFFSHORE  
DRILLING AND FRACKING**

**WHEREAS**, California's ocean and coastal waters provide habitat to a vast array of wildlife, including fish, whales, sea turtles and birds that depend upon a healthy and clean environment; and

**WHEREAS**, offshore oil and gas drilling and exploration off the Pacific coast place these coastal resources at risk of oil spills and other damage, and in 2012, Tourism and Recreation, alone, accounted for \$17.6 billion in California's shore-adjacent communities<sup>1</sup>; and

**WHEREAS**, 69% of California adults oppose offshore drilling, including a majority of coastal Republicans and Democrats, per the Public Policy Institute of California<sup>2</sup>; and

**WHEREAS**, some of the largest uncontrolled oil releases in history, including the Ixtoc I oil spill of 1979 and Deepwater Horizon oil spill of 2010<sup>3</sup>, have been from drilling wells in fragile near shore marine environments; and

**WHEREAS**, a massive oil spill in 1969 off the coast of Santa Barbara fouled coastal waters and caused catastrophic environmental damage<sup>4</sup>, and in 2015 a pipeline servicing offshore oil platforms burst and fouled the coast<sup>5</sup>, damaging wildlife and coastal recreation; and

**WHEREAS**, State waters off of the California coast have been off-limits to new oil drilling since 1969, per the California State Lands Commission, the Commission's support of the ban continues due

to the availability of promising renewable energy alternatives which do not pose the same environmental threats<sup>6</sup> <sup>7</sup>; and

**WHEREAS**, federal offshore oil and gas leasing has not been expanded off of the California coast since 1984<sup>8</sup>; and

**WHEREAS**, President Donald J. Trump’s Executive Order 13795<sup>9</sup>, “Implementing an America-First Offshore Energy Strategy,” could open these regions to new drilling, fracking, and other well stimulation, putting California’s valuable coastal resources at greater risk.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Lake resolves as follows:

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA**, that the County of Lake supports: (1) continued prohibition of new federal oil and gas leases in areas of the Pacific currently protected from new leases; (2) strict enforcement of regulations on existing oil and gas extraction facilities off the California coast designed to protect the coast from environmental damage; and (3) with the exceptions of required maintenance to optimize existing wells and reasonable replacement of previously productive wells, a ban on new drilling, fracking and other well stimulation in federal and state waters off the California coast.
