SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE 2018 LAKEPORT SPRINT BOAT GRAND PRIX Sponsored by

Clear Lake Motorsports Enterprises

APPROVED DATES AND LOCATION:

Friday June 1 through Sunday June 3, 2018 for an area of approximately 45 acres extending from 300 feet offshore of Library Park up to one mile from the shoreline.

INSURANCE CONDITIONS:

- 1) Just as last year, the event organizer will provide proof of insurance for \$9 million naming the County as an additional insured.
- 2) An indemnification agreement will be required.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Sponsor will pay for two Lake County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) marine patrol deputies, a landbased deputy and a dedicated dispatcher for June 3 and 4.
- 2. LCSO deputies will not participate in the clearing and security of the course. That is the responsibility of the promoter and organizer. They will be available to enforce violations of the law.
- 3. The County reserves the right to end the event in the event of an accident involving serious bodily injury or death.
- 4. The event organizer will provide three (3) two-way radios with sufficient batteries for assigned LCSO employees to use to communicate with event staff.
- 5. The event organizer will provide race course perimeter patrols and buoy markers
- 6. The event organizer will identify specific sections of the course in a manner that allows responding resources to identify where they need to respond for services. For example, the rectangular course should have each leg designated as a number (1-4) or letter (A-D), and that information will be relayed to the personnel securing the course perimeter with direction to use these designations when requesting assistance from LCSO and/or Dispatch.
- 7. The course layout will conform with the diagram provided by the promoter to the County. This course diagram shall be the same diagram as is provided to the insurance carrier. The distances from shoreline shall be adhered to during the event.
- 8. Coordinate with the yacht club to provide satisfactory accommodations for sailboats moored in the race course
- 9. Remove and replace mooring and 5 mph buoys
- 10. Provide training and signage for volunteers patrolling the course perimeter
- 11. Coordinate with directors of other events on Clear Lake the weekend of June 1-3

- 12. Post notices in area newspapers alerting boaters about the boat access closures in Lakeport, delineation of the race course and about the need to comply with instructions from volunteer patrols
- 13. Establish a means to safely accommodate boats involved in the Wood & Glory event
- 14. Establish an area for Quagga mussel inspection of competitor's boats
- 15. Provide an area for County quagga mussel booth and boat display.
