Background

Program Narrative Attachment #1

In Lake County Sheriff's Office Property/Evidence and Crime Scene Investigation Unit there is one supervisor and one evidence technician who receive, log, and store over 6,000 items of property/evidence each year; as well as filling all requests for copies of evidence, preprocessing evidence in the lab, and transporting evidence to various labs. They are also tasked with processing crime scenes for major cases, which includes processing, documenting, storing, and transporting evidence to various crime labs.

Because the intake of property and evidence will continue to grow, with no time to focus on larger tasks of examining cold case files, untested sexual assault evidence, and purging of adjudicated cases, the additional funding will have an immediate impact on allowing for the time needed to focus on these tasks.

The goals of this program are as follows:

- 1. Review cold case files focusing on untested forensic evidence to be processed for investigative leads.
- 2. Review all sexual assault cases to identify unsolved/untested sexual assault evidence.
- 3. Preprocess forensic evidence prior to transporting to DOJ labs for analysis by case specific criminalists (DNA, ballistic, et al).
- 4. Transporting forensic evidence to be analyzed by DNA, ballistic criminalists, et al.
- 5. Research cases to purge evidence in order to make room in the property/evidence storage facility for new forensic evidence.
- 6. Complete monthly and annual statistical reports of forensic evidence intake/storage/processing.
- 7. Assist in the implementation of the new property/evidence barcode system to store and track forensic evidence.
- 8. Conduct yearly inventory of property/evidence facility.

Performance measures will include monthly reporting on unit statistics as well as monthly monitoring of forensic evidence processed/purged, in order to ensure goals are being met. Additionally, an annual statistical report will be produced comparing prior year accomplishments with current accomplishments.

- 1. Review cold case files focusing on untested forensic evidence to be processed for investigative leads.
- 2. Review all sexual assault cases to identify unsolved/untested sexual assault evidence.
- 3. Preprocess forensic evidence prior to transporting to DOJ labs for analysis by case specific criminalists (DNA, ballistic, et al).
- 4. Transporting forensic evidence to be analyzed by DNA, ballistic criminalists, et al.
- 5. Research cases to purge evidence in order to make room in the property/evidence storage facility for new forensic evidence.
- 6. Complete monthly and annual statistical reports of forensic evidence intake/storage/processing.
- 7. Assist in the implementation of the new property/evidence barcode system to store and track forensic evidence.
- 8. Conduct yearly inventory of property/evidence facility.

Strategies to be used to accomplish these goals will include:

The evidence supervisor and evidence technician currently employed are only able to keep up with daily tasks; with an additional person we can combat the overwhelming influx of property and evidence. We will also include members of the Major Crimes Unit, who would be tasked with the follow-up investigation for the forensic evidence found untested.

Evidence personnel will work in conjunction with not only the Major Crimes Unit, but also Victim Witness, the District Attorney's Office, and other law enforcement agencies to ensure all investigative leads are exhausted, to ensure that victims receive some semblance of closure.

Evidence personnel will use the available lab and equipment to preprocess all forensic evidence before transporting to the DOJ lab, et al., which will tremendously reduce the amount of time it takes to receive identification of known or suspected offenders who prey on vulnerable persons in order to ensure that cases brought for prosecution are "beyond a reasonable doubt" cases. Evidence personnel will document all their cases in the existing records management system, which will allow quick retrieval of statistical information on a monthly basis, as well as annually, for comparison and evaluation of effectiveness.
