CEQA. The Board of Supervisors independently finds and determines that this 4 **Section 5:** action is exempt from CEOA pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 5 26055(h) for the adoption of an ordinance, rule, or regulation by a local jurisdiction 6 7 that requires discretionary review and approval of permits, licenses, or other authorizations to engage in commercial cannabis activity where the discretionary 8 review in any such law, ordinance, rule, or regulation includes any applicable 9 environmental review pursuant to Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) 10 of the Public Resources Code; and, under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA 11 Guidelines, as an activity that is covered by the general rule that CEOA applies 12 only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the 13 environment. The general exemption applies in this instance because it can be seen 14 with certainty that there is no possibility that the proposed amendments could have 15 a significant effect on the environment, and thus are not subject to CEQA. Thus, 16 it can be seen with certainty that the proposed project would not have a significant 17 effect on the environment. 18 Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any 19 Section 6. person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance, including 20 the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances shall 21 not be affected thereby and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, 22 provisions of this Ordinance are severable. The Board of Supervisors hereby 23 declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, 24 paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase hereof irrespective of the fact that any one 25 or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or 26 27 phrases be held unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable. Section 7: Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect on the day of ______, 2019 28 and within fifteen (15) days after adoption of the ordinance, the Clerk to the Board 29 of Supervisors shall publish a summary of the ordinance with the names of those 30 supervisors voting for and against the ordinance and the clerk shall post in the 31 office of the Clerk to the Board of Supervisors a certified copy of the full text of 32 the adopted ordinance along with the names of those supervisors voting for and 33 against the ordinance. 34 The Foregoing ordinance was introduced before the Board of Supervisors on the 35 , 2019, and passed by the following vote on the day of 2019. 36 AYES: 37
