## 2019 ANNUAL OPERATING AND FINANCIAL PLAN

This Annual Financial and Operating Plan (Annual Operating Plan), is hereby made and entered into by and between the Lake County Sheriff's Office, hereinafter referred to as "the Cooperator" and the USDA, Forest Service, Mendocino National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the provisions of Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement #16-LE-11051360-002 executed on December 09, 2015. This Annual Operating Plan is made and agreed to as of the last date signed below and is for the estimated period beginning October 1, 2018 and ending September 30, 2019.

B. Reimbursement for all types of enforcement activities shall be at the following rates unless specifically stated otherwise:

Mileage at \$0.41/Mile patrolled

Base Wage at \$52.00/Hour

Overtime Wages at \$62.50/Hour



#### II. AGREEMENTS:

Subject to available manpower and funding, it is hereby agreed:

## 1. The Lake County Sheriff's Office Agrees:

- a. Provide protection of persons and their property when they are visiting or using the Mendocino National Forest, and to utilize the opportunity to cooperate with the State and Federal agencies in carrying out their specific responsibilities related to the National Forest System.
- b. Mutually work together with Forest Service Law Enforcement Officers on criminal activities occurring on National Forest system lands.
- c. Work cooperatively and assist the Forest Service employees working with resource management issues within Lake County.
- d. When requested by the Forest Service, the County will dispatch additional sworn deputies, within availability of personnel, to assist with investigations, apprehensions, or detaining individuals suspected of offenses against the National Forest.
- e. Deputies assigned to these patrols will be regular Deputy Sheriffs meeting California Peace Officer Standard for Training. The purpose of these patrols are to provide protection for the public and law enforcement assistance for the Forest Service Law Enforcement Officers.
- f. Advise the Forest Service of all major ongoing incidents, investigations, and/or search and rescue activities, occurring on National Forest Service System Lands when Forest Service employee's safety, public safety, and/or resources that may be at risk.
- g. Complete and provide the forest service with Form: FS5300-5, Cooperative Law Enforcement Activity Report (attached). This form identifies the number and types of crimes occurring on National Forest Service lands.
- h. Deputies operating under this agreement will provide a patrol log identifying services rendered and activities preformed. The patrol log will be provided to the Patrol Captain by the county. No payment will be authorized until logs are received.
- i. Provide dispatch services to authorized Forest Service Law Enforcement Officers.
- j. To furnish itemized statements of expenses to the Forest Service for expenditures.

## 2. The Forest Service Agrees:

- a. Promptly provide the County with information on the incidents involving criminal activity associated with the crimes against persons and/or their property with the National Forest system.
- b. When requested by the County, to dispatch Law Enforcement Officers, within availability on the Forest Service, to incidents within the National Forest system lands, or having a nexus to the National Forest system.
- c. To advise the County of all major ongoing incidents, investigations, and/or operations that may require assistance from the county.
- d. To loan the Lake County Sheriff's Office equipment as needed when mutually agreed upon by both parties.
- e. That any action taken by a Lake County Deputy, acting under this agreement, to protect life, property, and /or resources on National Forest lands will be considered a reimbursable service.
- f. To process claims for reimbursement from Lake County within 30 days of receipt.

#### III. PATROL ACTIVITIES:

- A. Time schedules for patrols will be flexible to allow for emergencies, other priorities, and day-to-day needs of both Cooperator and the U.S. Forest Service. Ample time will be spent in each area to make residents and visitors aware that law enforcement officers are in the vicinity.
  - 1. Patrol on following U.S. Forest Service roads:

Lake Pillsbury Basin area: To make vehicle patrols within the Lake Pillsbury Basin, to include campgrounds and public access roads. Time and duration will be agreed upon by the Cooperator and the Forest Service. Primary patrols will be conducted during HIGH visitor use season May1, 2019 through September 30, 2019

2. Patrol in the following campgrounds, developed sites or dispersed areas:

Mendocino National Forest, general patrol: High visibility patrols during opening weekends of deer season (rifle). This includes all campgrounds



and dispersed campsites within Lake County of the Mendocino National Forest.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$9,000.00 Unused dispatch funds may be used for patrol activities, in which case the maximum reimbursement may not exceed the amount of: \$11,000.00

#### IV. DISPATCH SERVCES:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-L for additional information.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$2,000.00

#### V. EQUIPMENT:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-L, IV-M, and, IV-N for additional information.

No funds are authorized for equipment purchase unless otherwise agreed to in advance of and equipment purchase.

#### VI. SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT SITUATIONS:

- A. Special Enforcement Situations include but are not limited to: Fire Emergencies, Drug Enforcement, and certain Group Gatherings.
- B. Funds available for special enforcement situations vary greatly from year to year and must be specifically requested and approved prior to any reimbursement being authorized. Requests for funds should be made to the U.S. Forest Service designated representative listed in Item I-A of this Annual Operating Plan. The designated representative will then notify the Cooperator whether funds will be authorized for reimbursement. If funds are authorized, the parties will then jointly prepare a revised Annual Operating Plan.

This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notice, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organizational rendezvous.

#### VII. BILLING FREQUENCY:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provisions II-H and III-B for additional information.

A. For services requested in items III, and, IV reimbursement will be based upon itemized bills furnished either monthly, quarterly, or as a lump sum, along with certification that the services have performed. Final billing for reimbursement must be received by the forest Service before **October 30, 2019**.
