Basic Project Description:

Installation of a multi-carrier wireless communications facility consisting of an 85' tall monopine, faux tree, antenna support structure within a 50' x 50' fenced equipment compound. The multi-carrier facility is designed to accommodate up to four (4) wireless communication carriers with panel antennas and microwave dishes concealed in the monopine and ground mounted base transceiver station equipment in a fenced compound.

Planning Commission

Approval:

January 24, 2019 the Planning Commission issued a unanimous approval of the

project for a Major Use Permit for a Wireless Communications Facility

(UP 18-01 & IS 18-06).



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Response to Appeal AB 19-01

Appeal Reason Responses:

1) Pre-Judicial Placement

Horizon Tower representative was seated in location as directed by County and did not use overhead projector.

2) Concern with cultural resource preservation

See attached Cultural Assessment and Federal and State Tribal responses from Geist Engineering and Environmental Group.

Twenty-Two tribes were contacted.

3) Lack of consideration to wildlife in the area

See attached Biological Resource Assessment response from Geist Engineering and Environmental Group.

4) Concern over two earthquake faults

The proposed facility will be designed and constructed in accord with the County building code requirements. A geotechnical analysis will be conducted and the findings incorporated into the antenna support structure foundation design.

See attached response from Geist Engineering and Environmental Group.

5) Concern of decrease in RE values

See Valbridge Property Advisers – Phoenix, Arizona Market Study - Executive Summary, which concludes:

"There is primarily no measurable difference in the values of those homes located within the cell tower sphere of influence (within 0.25-miles of a cell tower site)....."

Also, over 50% of U.S. Households no longer have land line telephone services and rely solely on wireless communication connections. Therefore, access to reliable and robust wireless telecommunication services, such as will be provided by the proposed facility, is a necessity and will actually improve property values.

6) Cell tower location

See rebuttal from Richard & Sherry Gubera. A representative from Verizon initially contacted the property owner regarding development of a cell tower.

The proposed facility is allowed on the subject property with a Major Use Permit which was approved by unanimous decision by the Planning Commission. The proposed facility meets all of the County code requirements for siting on the subject property.

- 7) The planning commission states that the cell tower will not be visually obtrusive
 - Photo simulations were submitted with the original application and they show a minimal visual impact.
 - The location was selected to minimize impact on view corridors.
 - There are other trees in the area of similar height and the proposed antenna support structure will have a backdrop allowing it to blend in with the surrounding area.

Horizon Tower suggests revising the Planning Commission approval to allow for installation of a faux pine tree as it will blend in better than the faux broadleaf structure.

- 8) We were not given proper time to discuss issues
 - The three minute time limit is a County code protocol.
 - County code protocol will dictate the appeal hearing process.
 - Depositions are subject to the appropriate legal filings.
 - The Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS 18-06) was posted by the County on August 15, 2018, over 5 months prior to the Planning Commission public hearing.
 - The County sent out and published several notices regarding this project in accord with code.

Summary

The project obtained a unanimous approval from the Planning Commission and has letters of support from the Kelseyville Fire Protection District, CalFire, California Highway Patrol and the Lake County Sheriff Department.

Horizon Tower respectfully requests that the Board of Supervisors deny Appeal AB 19-01.

The below is a response to regarding Federal and State tribal responses for the proposed Horizon Toer, LLC Undertaking (Twenty Two (22) tribes contacted)

On behalf of Horizon Tower, LLC Geist Engineering and Environmental Group, Inc. (GE²G), has prepared this summary of the completed state of Federal Tribes contact

Federal Tribe Summary:

GE²G directly requested a Tower Construction Notification System (TCNS) request on December 19, 2017 through the FCC Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. The GE²G TCNS request was formally initiated by the FCC on December 22, 2017. The received TCNS Notification # 165264 email lists the federal Tribes identified through the FCC TCNS process. As requested by the Tribes, GE²G has provided backup information where requested. None of the identified TCNS Tribes have expressed an interest in Native American monitoring or made other requests with the proposed Horizon Tower, LLC undertaking with the exception of the Scotts Valley Rancheria who requested that a Cultural Monitor be present for excavation activities. They indicated that they are not aware of cultural resources to be present but they would like to be present.



Radiation Safety Guidelines

Horizon Tower has proposed to operate a tower that will facilitate antennas.

The FCC is required by the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, among other things, to evaluate the effect of emissions from FCC-regulated transmitters on the quality of the human environment. Several organizations, such as the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc. (IEEE), and the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP) have issued recommendations for human exposure to RF electromagnetic fields. On August 1, 1996, the Commission adopted the NCRP's recommended Maximum Permissible Exposure limits for field strength and power density for the transmitters operating at frequencies of 300 kHz to 100 GHz. In addition, the Commission adopted the specific absorption rate (SAR) limits for devices operating within close proximity to the body as specified within the ANSI/IEEE C95.1-1992 guidelines.

On March 27, 2013, the FCC voted to advance its review of its various rules pertaining to the implementation of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements related to radiofrequency (RF) emissions from radio transmitters. The FCC has divided this process into three parts: a Report and Order (Order) and a Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (Further Notice) in ET Docket No. 03-137, and a Notice of Inquiry (Inquiry) in a new docket, ET Docket No. 13-84. In the Order the FCC concludes several technical and semantic issues initiated in 2003 that revise and update its regulations implementing NEPA. In the Further Notice the FCC proposes to further update and revise its procedures beyond its 2003 proposals. In the Inquiry the FCC requests comment to determine whether its RF exposure limits and policies need to be reassessed. Since consideration of the limits themselves is explicitly outside of the scope of ET Docket No. 03-137, the FCC opens a new docket, ET Docket No. 13-84, with the Inquiry to consider these limits in light of more recent developments. The Inquiry is intended to open discussion on both the currency of our RF exposure limits and possible policy approaches regarding RF exposure. While the FCC has continuously monitored research and conferred with experts in this field, and is confident in its RF exposure guidelines and the soundness of the basis for its rules, it is a matter of good government to periodically reexamine regulations and their implementation.

Additionally, GE²G checked with the FFC Biological point of contact Ms. Joelle Gehring, PhD on February 21, 2019 regarding avian exposure to RF regarding potential Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA) potential impacts. Ms. Gehring stated that the FCC has no additional limits or restrictions regarding wildlife other than the above FCC specifications.

USFWS - Migratory Birds:

The United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) recommendations published in Interim Guidelines for Recommendations on Communication Tower Siting, Construction, Operation, and Decommissioning (2016) state the preferred tower design to decrease potential effects on migratory

birds is less than 200 feet tall, with no guys and no lights. The siting and design process for this project conforms to the USFWS preferred recommendations. In addition, it has included mitigating factors such as consideration of collocation and tower siting with existing towers or in minimally sensitive areas.

Finding:

Horizon Tower, LLC will commit to have the antennas operate within the specified emissions from FCC-regulated antennas. Horizon Tower. LLC will retain a third party RF consult to verify the tower mounted antennas are in compliance with the most current FCC regulations for humans and wildlife.

Out of 37 paired sales in five sub-areas, 20 pairings indicated higher values for those sales within the 0.25 mile sphere of influence, while 17 pairings indicated lower values.

My wife and I were approached in June, 2016 by Epic Wireless on behalf of Verizon to develop a cell site on our property. We were notified that Verizon was on track to install a cell site and our Mojave Trail site was one of the 3 final properties to be considered to build a new cell site.

Having no experience with this type of project, I called my friend who is in this business, John Kapulica from Horizon Tower. John and I have a 15 year friendship. John has been involved with hundreds of projects which helped my wife and I understand typical benefits and liabilities of such a project.

After many questions to John about cell site safety and my own research, my wife and I agreed to proceed with the project with one caveat- Verizon would work with Horizon Tower as developer.

After what seemed to be a year, Verizon chose to work with Horizon Tower's proposition. Evidently, our Mojave Trail site was selected above 2 other sites.

Horizon Tower has done significant work at much expense to satisfy County requirements and make sure the site has minimal effect on the community's aesthetics and environment.

For example, the structure height was lowered and camouflaged to simulate the look and height of an indigenous tree.

Also, the original site identified on our property was closer to the neighbors than the final proposed location.

Regarding Mojave Trail, the County road that is used to access the subject property, we expect the County to maintain the public section of this road as a private party cannot work on a public road.
