Amending the nuisance abatement notice requirements for mitigation is commendable for the deterrence of radiant wildfires, it may very well preclude the participation of owners at some distance from Lake County, such as ourselves currently in Sonora, Mexico, who may have to endure 14 days of isolation before proceeding to the county. As the Public Health Officer notes, immigration of potential carriers of the Covid-19 to a rural county such as Lake could overwhelm the response abilities of the county.

Your decision on this matter shall indicate the importance you prescribe to either radiant fires or spread of the pandemic.

Although the opportunity to notify property owners through the annual tax notice has passed for this year, it would still be possible to include a notice of nuisance abatement requirements in next year's tax notice. Not everyone in the country knows about this requirement.
