RESOLUTION CERTIFYING THE FINAL ENVIRONEMTNAL IMPACT REPOR, AND ADOPTING THE CEQA FINDINGS OF FACT, STATEMENT OF OVERRIDING CONSIDERATIONS AND THE MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM FOR THE GUENOC VALLEY MIX USE COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has reviewed and considered the environmental effects of the proposed Guenoc Valley Mixed Use Commercial Development Project as set forth in the Final Environmental Impact Report (SCH # 2019049134); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors found the Final EIR in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and the State CEQA Guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has conducted a duly noticed public hearing on a Mitigation and Monitoring and Reporting Program (Exhibit A) for the Guenoc valley Mixed Use Commercial Development Project, with recommendations and the reasons herein and

WHEREAS, all individuals, groups and agencies desiring to comment were given adequate opportunity to submit oral and written comments on the Guenoc Valley Mixed Use Commercial Development Project and all environmental review documents; and

WHEREAS, the CEQA Findings adopting the Mitigation and Monitoring Program state the County's conclusions regarding the significance of the potential environmental impacts of the Proposed Project after all feasible mitigation measures have been adopted.

WHEREAS, the findings have been prepared to comply with the requirements of CEQA and the CEQA Guidelines and are based on information in the Draft and Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Proposed Project and on all other relevant information contained in the administrative record for the proposed project, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors found that the mitigation measures identified in the Final EIR mitigate the potential significant impacts of the Proposed Project, to the extent feasible, as described in the Final EIR; and

WHEREAS, by adopting the feasible mitigation measures listed in the EIR as conditions of approval where appropriate, and by establishing a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) to ensure implementation of all mitigation measures, the County will ensure the corresponding significant impacts are avoided or reduced to the maximum extent feasible, and

WHEREAS, on July 7, 2020, at a duly noticed public hearing, the Board of Supervisors independently reviewed and evaluated the CEQA Findings of Fact and Statement of Overriding Considerations enumerated herein (**Exhibit B**); and

WHEREAS, on July 7, 2020, at a duly noticed public hearing, the Board of Supervisors certified the Final EIR.
