### Dear Sateur Ham:

Records at this office were reviewed to determine if this project could adversely affect cultural resources. Please note that use of the term cultural resources includes both archaeological sites and historical buildings and/or structures. The review for possible historic-era building/structures, however, was limited to references currently in our office and should not be considered comprehensive.

**Project Description:** The proposed project entails a Major Use Permit to allow one A-Type 3: "Outdoor" cultivation for adult use cannabis totaling 43,560 sq ft of canopy area within an approximately 65,000 sq ft cultivation area. Proposed improvements consist of a security fence, a security system, employee parking, a storage shed, water tanks, and a solar power array.

## **Previous Studies:**

XX Study #S-50287 (Arrington and Stapleton 2017), covering approximately 100% of the proposed project area, identified no <u>cultural resources</u> (see recommendations below).

# **Archaeological and Native American Resources Recommendations:**

XX Based on an evaluation of the environmental setting and features associated with known sites, Native American resources in this part of Lake County have been found near areas of oak woodland, as well as near a variety of plant and animal resources. Sites are also found near watercourses and bodies of water. The proposed project area encompasses a partially wooded hillslope on Bishop Mountain. The project area contains a stream and is in proximity to several

other watercourses. Given the similarity of these environmental factors, the environmental setting of the proposed project area should be considered moderately sensitive for Native American resources. However, a recent cultural resources study (Arrington and Stapleton 2017) identified no archaeological resources within the project area. Therefore, further study for archaeological resources is not recommended at this time.

XX We recommend that the lead agency contact the local Native American tribe(s) regarding traditional, cultural, and religious heritage values. For a complete listing of tribes in the vicinity of the project, please contact the Native American Heritage Commission at (916) 373-3710.

### **Built Environment Recommendations:**

XX Since the Office of Historic Preservation has determined that any building or structure 45 years or older may be of historical value, if the project area contains such properties, it is recommended that prior to commencement of project activities, a qualified professional familiar with the architecture and history of Lake County conduct a formal CEQA evaluation.

Due to processing delays and other factors, not all of the historical resource reports and resource records that have been submitted to the Office of Historic Preservation are available via this records search. Additional information may be available through the federal, state, and local agencies that produced or paid for historical resource management work in the search area. Additionally, Native American tribes have historical resource information not in the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) Inventory, and you should contact the California Native American Heritage Commission for information on local/regional tribal contacts.

The California Office of Historic Preservation (OHP) contracts with the California Historical Resources Information System's (CHRIS) regional Information Centers (ICs) to maintain information in the CHRIS inventory and make it available to local, state, and federal agencies, cultural resource professionals, Native American tribes, researchers, and the public. Recommendations made by IC coordinators or their staff regarding the interpretation and application of this information are advisory only. Such recommendations do not necessarily represent the evaluation or opinion of the State Historic Preservation Officer in carrying out the OHP's regulatory authority under federal and state law.
