Executive Summary: The State of California enacted Assembly Bill 1976 (Chapter 140, Statutes of 2020), which requires counties to affirmatively opt-out of providing Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT), also known as Laura’s Law, by passing a resolution of the local governing body stating the reasons for opting out and any facts or circumstances relied on in making that decision.
