Executive Summary: (include fiscal and staffing impact narrative):

Annually, the State of California's Procurement Division, complying with legal competitive bidding requirements, solicits vehicle bids throughout the State of California. A State Contract is issued to the low bidders and the results are published and distributed to local agencies. Local agencies are given the opportunity to purchase these vehicles through the state at the same cost as the state. In an effort to purchase vehicles locally, vehicle make and models are identified in the State Contract and this detailed information is delivered to our local dealership to solicit their proposals on

and this detailed information is delivered to our local dealership to solicit their proposals on suggested or equivalent vehicles.

The local vendor provided a proposal on an equivalent vehicle to the State bid vehicle, however their price was not within the County Local Vendor Preference limits, as defined in the Purchasing Ordinance. A summary of bids received is attached.

We recommend that the Board of Supervisors (a) waive the formal bidding process, per Ordinance #2406, Purchasing Code No. 38.4, making a determination that this purchase complies with the
