Lake County has taken important steps towards prevention and early intervention, and FFPSA would help our county move our prevention vision forward. The Children's Council began working with Strategies 2.0 in 2018. Through this partnership, a workgroup was formed and the participants, from private and public agencies, created a vision for Lake County. It was decided that it was time to adopt a county-wide strategy that shifted our focus from abuse prevention to acknowledging and building on community strengths. The workgroup became known as "Resilient Lake County".
